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FROM OUR CHAIRMAN, KEITH RICHARDSON

When one looks back at the contribution of Masicorp over the past 25 years, then I can only describe it as 'significant'.

I think 'significant' is one of the greatest compliments which can be given to an individual or an institution. To say that someone is 'good' is a fair compliment, to say he/she is 'great' is a real compliment but to say that someone is 'significant' is the highest form of praise.

'Significant' means that you have made a positive difference in some sphere of life. It means that others look up to you as a source of inspiration. In the case of Masicorp, it also means that Masicorp is changing lives.

It was shortly after the release of Nelson Mandela when a group of individuals saw the human disaster that was unfolding in Site 5, now Masiphumelele. John and Carol Thompson initiated and drove the concept of a future Masicorp and they breathed life into that well-known quote from their countrywoman, anthropologist Margaret Mead when she famously said: *Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed, citizens can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has.*

It is fitting that shortly before the 25th year of inception of Masicorp that John Thompson was awarded an MBE by King Charles III for his work in the township of Masiphumelele. Carol was quick to say: *From the very beginning of our fundraising efforts, John and I reached out to everyone we knew. This award isn't just for us; it's a recognition of the collective effort of our entire community.*

For having done that effectively and productively, we thank the staff and the volunteers over the years who, especially recently under the leadership of Milli Firth, have all poured passion and energy into the management and organisation of the many projects initiated by Masicorp.

From the beginning, Masicorp has boldly proclaimed: *Our goal is to give the community of Masiphumelele a hand up and not a handout.* I discovered a similar sentiment recently on a birthday card: *'As you grow older, you will discover that you have two hands – one for helping yourself, the other for helping others.'*

I dedicate that sentiment on the card, originally attributed to Audrey Hepburn the actress, to all the funders and supporters of Masicorp.

It is fitting that I finish off with the inspiring words of John Thompson when he received his MBE: *In this journey we have created a good life for many people, and that's what we encourage others to do. If you can help someone, and make a difference, do it. The beauty is that anyone can do this.*



FROM OUR MD, MILLI FIRTH

This report showcases OUR STORY for 2023, highlighting Masicorp's efforts as an NGO offering specialised educational programmes to the community of Masiphumelele within the challenges and context of South Africa in 2023.

In selecting information for this report, we aim to communicate the essence of Masicorp, including its people, opportunities, strategy, impact, and growth.

The daily lives of the children in Masi are fraught with uncertainty. Unfortunately, this extends to learning opportunities and resources. Together with the community's teachers and leaders, we seek to address these concerns through our 27 programmes that benefit over 4,000 children and adults.

Our focus remains on improving access to quality education while enhancing the capacity of educators and creating opportunities for skills development and training.

With future prospects in mind, we took a giant leap forward by purchasing property just outside Masi. The property is large with immense potential for long-term education and skills development opportunities for the Masi community. This shift moves us away from a "lack of opportunities" towards fostering "positive aspirations" among our youth and young adults. None of this would be possible without our faithful donors, friends of the Masicorp community, and staff who share our vision for the future. People believe in what we are doing and want to be part of finding solutions.

We extend heartfelt thanks to our exceptional board members, devoted volunteers, and dedicated staff who work tirelessly in our education programmes. Your unwavering commitment combined with your passion for empowering others through education is truly inspiring and has brought about significant change within our community. Your dedication is not just appreciated but also deeply admired.



OUR CORE PROJECTS

EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT

The early years in a child's life are critical for development, as this is a period of rapid physical, mental, emotional, social and moral growth. Our objectives are to raise the standards of care and learning outcomes, to provide a high-quality education and care, and to prepare and equip children for a successful school career.

PRIMARY SCHOOL EDUCATION

Our Maths, English and Science Learning Labs are key programmes in supporting education at Ukhanyo Primary School. Our English... Please! and Masifunde literacy programmes continue to improve the English language skills of children from Masiphumelele.

HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

At secondary education level, we work with partners to reach the youth of Masiphumelele through workshops, art and life skills programmes, and computer training courses.

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

The partnerships between Evangeline Ministries, The Sewing Café and Masicorp continue to offer life skills and training opportunities through sewing skills courses.

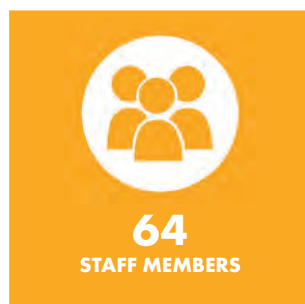
Our computer training programmes include free, internationally certified courses, as well as basic introductory courses for adults, teens and children. In addition to this training, one of our labs is open to the public to give community members free access to computers and the internet.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Masicorp provides an affordable space for training programmes to 14 non-profit organisations on the Chasmay Road Campus. We provide emergency relief support to the community during times of disaster. Masicorp also subsidises the provision of uniforms for children at Ukhanyo Primary School. Our support of a community sport programme benefited 95 individuals from Masi in 2023.

PARTNERSHIPS

We acknowledge and thank all of our partners - Evangeline Ministries, The Sewing Café, the Masiphumelele Creative Hub, the City of Cape Town, Ikamva Youth, the Chaeli Campaign, The Learning Initiative, and Inclusive Education South Africa - for their dedication and investment into educating and supporting the Masiphumelele community.



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EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT (ECD)

CHASMAY, MASI AND SUNNYDALE EDUCARE CENTRES

In 2023, Masicorp continued laying the foundations to help children from Masiphumelele develop their full potential and prepare for school. A total of 350 children were enrolled in Masicorp ECD centres, reflecting the growing awareness among parents of the benefits of quality early education and its impact on future academic success.

Partnerships are vital to the success of our programmes. These include a weekly sports programme with Coach Aya, occupational therapy interventions by the Chaeli Campaign, and weekly environmental lessons with Wild Hearts. Additional activities such as dance sessions, ocean-themed workshops, dress-up days, and special outings enriched the classroom experience.

A major highlight of the year was the continued expansion of our newest centre, Sunnydale Educare. Extensive renovations of the playground and three classrooms allowed us to double the number of children enrolled for 2024.

STAY & PLAY

This year, 17 informal crèches and 350 children participated in this programme which aims to improve the standard of early childhood education at informal crèches in Masiphumelele. This long-running initiative sees crèche owners receiving support in stimulating the children in their care. This year, the Stay & Play hub (located at Sunnydale Educare) received a much-needed facelift, and the children are now also enjoying the newly renovated playground. The hub is also the new home of an afternoon homework club, where primary school children from Masiphumelele can receive homework support, supervision and an afternoon snack.

SCHOOL FEEDING

Under the guidance of a passionate and dedicated volunteer, the Chasmay Educare garden produced a bountiful harvest. These vegetables supplement the nutritious meals served daily to the children at our three ECD centres. Each child receives two cooked meals daily: a cooked breakfast and a lunch containing at least four vegetables. Additionally, two fruit snacks and a sandwich are provided for those staying late. These meals have significantly improved school attendance, even during holidays, as parents trust that their children will be fed and cared for each day.

TEACHER TRAINING

Our ECD team is a significant part of Masicorp's staff, comprising 28 teachers, administrators, and kitchen managers, all from the Masiphumelele community. In 2023, one teacher completed her Grade R teaching certificate, and another is studying for a diploma in Grade R teaching. A fathers' programme highlighted the importance of fathers in children's lives. The team also attended courses in CPR, epilepsy management, and child protection training. Teachers learned to create art using recycled materials, received nutrition advice, and attended mental health sessions.





OUR NEWEST PROJECT

SUNNYDALE EDUCARE & THE FUTURE MASICORP EDUCATION CENTRE

In 2021, The Love & Care Trust approached Masicorp to manage an early childhood development centre (formally known as Love & Care), situated at 5 Guinea Fowl Road in Sunnydale.

Through fundraising efforts and with the support of the Love & Care Trust, initial renovations were undertaken to restore this school to its former glory. The school re-opened in 2021 as Sunnydale Educare, the third ECD centre under Masicorp's banner.

Over the next two years, further renovations slowly took place, allowing Masicorp to upgrade the playground, increase the number of classrooms and improve the kitchen and bathroom facilities. A second building on this site was also renovated, and is today home to Masicorp's Stay & Play programme. Our partners at Masiphumelele Creative Hub share this building, and their thriving food garden is a striking addition to the property.

During 2023, Masicorp renovated the buildings and playground even further so that 110 children under the age of six could be enrolled into Sunnydale Educare the following year.

During this time, Masicorp was also offered the opportunity to purchase this property from the Love & Care Trust. This would be the first time that Masicorp would own land – an exciting step forward for the organisation. Thanks to extensive fundraising undertaken in the United States, the sale was finalised with the aim that Masicorp would develop this property to benefit the Masiphumelele community even further.

With the purchase of this property, a vision for the future of Masicorp was born. 5 Guinea Fowl Road would one day be the site of the future Masicorp Education Centre. Sunnydale Educare would continue to operate from this site and other programmes located here would include the construction of a multipurpose centre and six classrooms. These classrooms would be utilised for adult and youth skills training and after-schools programmes. With Sunnydale Educare (benefitting the youngest members of the community) this centre will truly be an education hub for all, living up to Masicorp's vision of being "a partner in education for life".

In 2024, Masicorp will celebrate 25 years of supporting the Masiphumelele community and will also launch the fundraising campaign for the future Masicorp Education Centre – a campaign of two phases, with an estimated goal of R25 million.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank various partners and supporters who have made this exciting vision for the future possible. To the Love & Care Trust, thank you for your generosity and the immense trust you have in Masicorp, to grow and continue your legacy. Thanks to you, we have been able to once again turn Sunnydale Educare into a place of learning and joy for the community of Masiphumelele.

We would also like to thank those friends and funders who have given so generously over the last three years to help us restore this property into the shining beacon of education it is today. To our US funders and founders of Masicorp, trustees and volunteers who give of their time and skills to help us raise funds for the purchase of this property – thank you for this wonderful gift.



PRIMARY SCHOOL EDUCATION

Recent statistics show that 81% of Grade 4 children in South Africa can't read for meaning*, and 30% of schools lack their own library. Additionally, South Africa's maths results rank third lowest among 64 countries. Despite these challenges, Masicorp remains committed to improving literacy and maths. Our interventions at the primary school level continue to yield significant positive progress among the children of Masiphumelele.

UKHANYO PRIMARY SCHOOL LEARNING LABS

The two bustling learning labs at Ukhanyo Primary School benefited 1,595 learners last year. Our interactive in-class maths lessons encourage teacher involvement and foster a love for maths. The after-school clubs offer coding, maths competitions, and games. In 2023, Ukhanyo Primary had the most participants in the National Olico Maths competition, with many learners winning their categories. The coding club was also introduced to foundation phase learners, necessitating the purchase of new devices to accommodate the increased interest.

The English Hub focused on Grades 2 and 3, continuing afternoon clubs and a lending library for older grades. Emphasis on phonics and basic writing skills resulted in improved reading among Grade 3 students. Several volunteers brought new energy to the Hub. An ongoing partnership with "Guardians of the Deep" offers monthly marine club workshops and special environmental-themed outings.

LITERACY PROGRAMMES

Masicorp's Masifunde (Let's Read) programme supports struggling learners in Grades 4-6 at Ukhanyo Primary School, providing small group environments to practise talking, reading, and writing in English. We aimed for a 10% improvement in reading, but 81% of participating learners achieved a 20% improvement.

The English...Please! programme operates in Fish Hoek, Sun Valley, and Simonstown primary schools, supporting Masiphumelele learners in improving their English literacy skills. In 2023, both reading skills and reading for understanding surpassed targets. Learners were enthusiastic, dedicated to their homework, and eager to read, resulting in visible confidence growth.

In 2023, other nearby schools requested similar assistance for their Masiphumelele learners. A new volunteer-run programme, "Tuesdays with Books", was developed and takes place every Tuesday after school at the Masiphumelele library.

HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

COMPUTER TRAINING

Masicorp aims for all high school learners in Masiphumelele to be computer literate by Grade 12. Our basic computer skills training and accredited ICDL course (International Computer Driving License) are helping high schoolers navigate the digital world. Top student Lerato achieved an impressive 93% on her ICDL certification in 2023. Students reported that these skills have assisted them with their studies, assignments, tertiary education applications, and CVs. The ongoing partnership with Ikamva Youth helps us identify dedicated and committed young participants for course enrolment.

ART FOR YOUTH

The “Brave Girls” programme, aimed at teen girls from Masiphumelele, is run in partnership with Masiphumelele Creative Hub. This programme uses art and creative expression to create a safe space for sharing stories and challenges. Highlights included a mural project in partnership with TEARS Animal Rescue and a visit from The Maiden Factor, an all-female yacht crew sharing inspirational stories. Workshops throughout the year focused on nature, a sense of place, food literacy, stamp and printmaking, self-portraits, substance abuse awareness, and community cleanliness.

SEWING COURSE

In the six-month afterschool programme, 38 high school learners from Masiphumelele learned to make pillowcases, shopping bags, aprons, pencil cases, and tracksuits. This programme is run in partnership with The Sewing Café.





SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

Masicorp’s skills development initiatives aim to help residents of Masiphumelele become “job-ready”.

DIGITAL SKILLS TRAINING

In response to increased electricity outages in 2023, Masicorp’s computer labs installed backup power supplies to ensure uninterrupted learning. The computer lab at Masiphumelele library continues to be a valuable digital resource for the community, providing skills training and free internet access for job searches, emails, research, and assignments. Staff are available to support those needing assistance. Each year, hundreds of parents use Masicorp’s support to submit digital school applications for their children, receiving help with scanning, emailing, printing, or uploading required documents.

The ICDL centre at Chasmay Campus offers both basic and accredited training for adults and high school participants. Participants report that the skills acquired have significantly improved their job readiness.

EVANGELINE LIFE SKILLS TRAINING

Run in partnership with Evangeline Ministries, this six-month course covers basic sewing, computer skills, and English for unemployed community members, mainly women. This combination of skills boosts participants’ confidence and workplace readiness. In 2023, 40 students graduated, each receiving a new sewing machine. The highlight of the year was the Evangeline Graduation ceremonies, where participants modelled outfits they had designed and sewn.





COMMUNITY SUPPORT

With your help, our support for the community of Masiphumelele goes well beyond education.

EMERGENCY RELIEF

This discretionary fund supports vulnerable individuals and organisations during times of need, such as COVID-19, floods, fires, or personal crises. In 2023, we ensured our programmes were “loadshedding-ready” to continue supporting the community despite electricity disruptions. All Masicorp programmes received equipment to enable continued operation during power outages.

Our focus on mental health and wellness included attending a Mental Health and Wellness Conference and offering professional counselling to staff.

COMMUNITY SPORT

In 2023, Masicorp supported structured community soccer and netball programmes for children and adults. The number of players increased, with many participating in tournaments. All players received new uniforms, and a donation of soccer balls aided in training.

CHASMAY CAMPUS

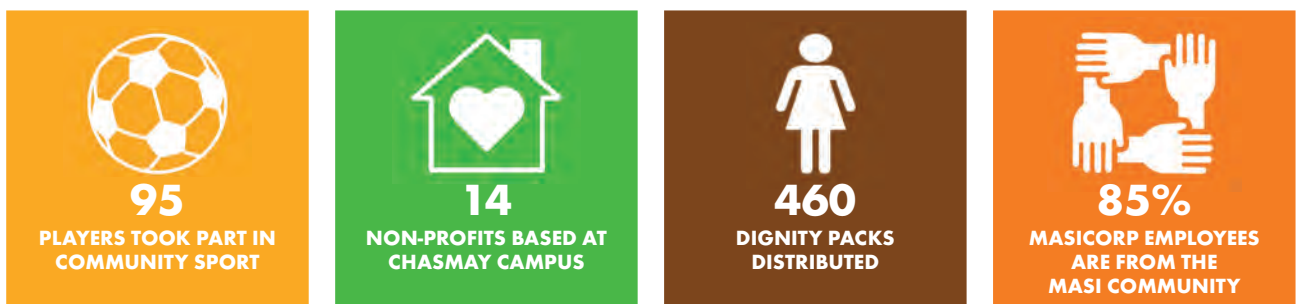
Masicorp continues to offer affordable and safe spaces at Chasmay Campus for local registered non-profit organisations and projects supporting Masiphumelele and nearby Ocean View residents. In 2023, 14 organisations benefited from this well-managed garden campus, with four fire marshals and first aiders trained.

DIGNITY PROJECT

This new project supports teenage girls at primary and high school with health information and donations of feminine hygiene products so they can continue to attend school during their monthly cycle. Health practitioners from local organisations and clinics conducted health checks and shared information on topics such as menstruation, HIV and contraceptive use.

SCHOOL UNIFORMS

Masicorp’s uniform project offers subsidised primary school tracksuits to parents from Masiphumelele. This programme addresses the issue of children missing school or wearing ill-fitting uniforms due to financial constraints. Masicorp subsidises the cost of uniforms, which are sewn at The Sewing Café by trained Masiphumelele residents. This initiative allows parents to purchase affordable uniforms, while Masicorp fundraises to cover the full cost. Masicorp also donates uniforms to individuals in need on a discretionary basis.





PARTNERSHIPS



Masicorp partner of many years, “The Sewing Café” recently achieved a significant milestone in their organisational development with the successful registration of their sewing training course with SETA. This accreditation is based on a learnership model and separates the training aspect of the organisation from the Clothing Manufacturing Business (CMT Services) they offer. In the future, this learnership will also be registered with QCTO (Quality Council For Trades & Occupations) and in 2024, the Sewing Café aims to become successfully registered as an NPO / NPC.

These registrations and accreditations enables The Sewing Café to source their own funding for this learnership programme and therefore marks an end to an era of the close partnership shared with Masicorp over many years.

We are happy to have played a role in this incredible growth with the support we have been able to provide to their training programmes in the past.

Masicorp will continue to partner with The Sewing Café on the school uniform programme. This programme allows us to supply affordable school tracksuits to Masi parents, made by hand by the men and women who have been trained in sewing skills at The Sewing Café.

We wish The Sewing Café everything of the best and are excited to see how their training programme continues to empower these learners to develop valuable and accredited skills for their future.

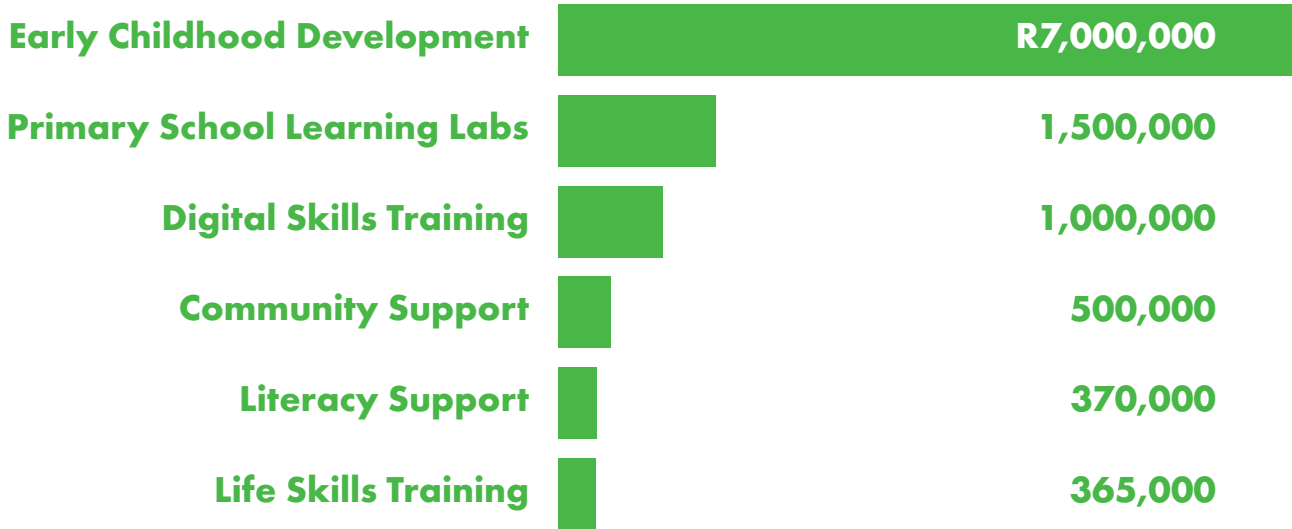
